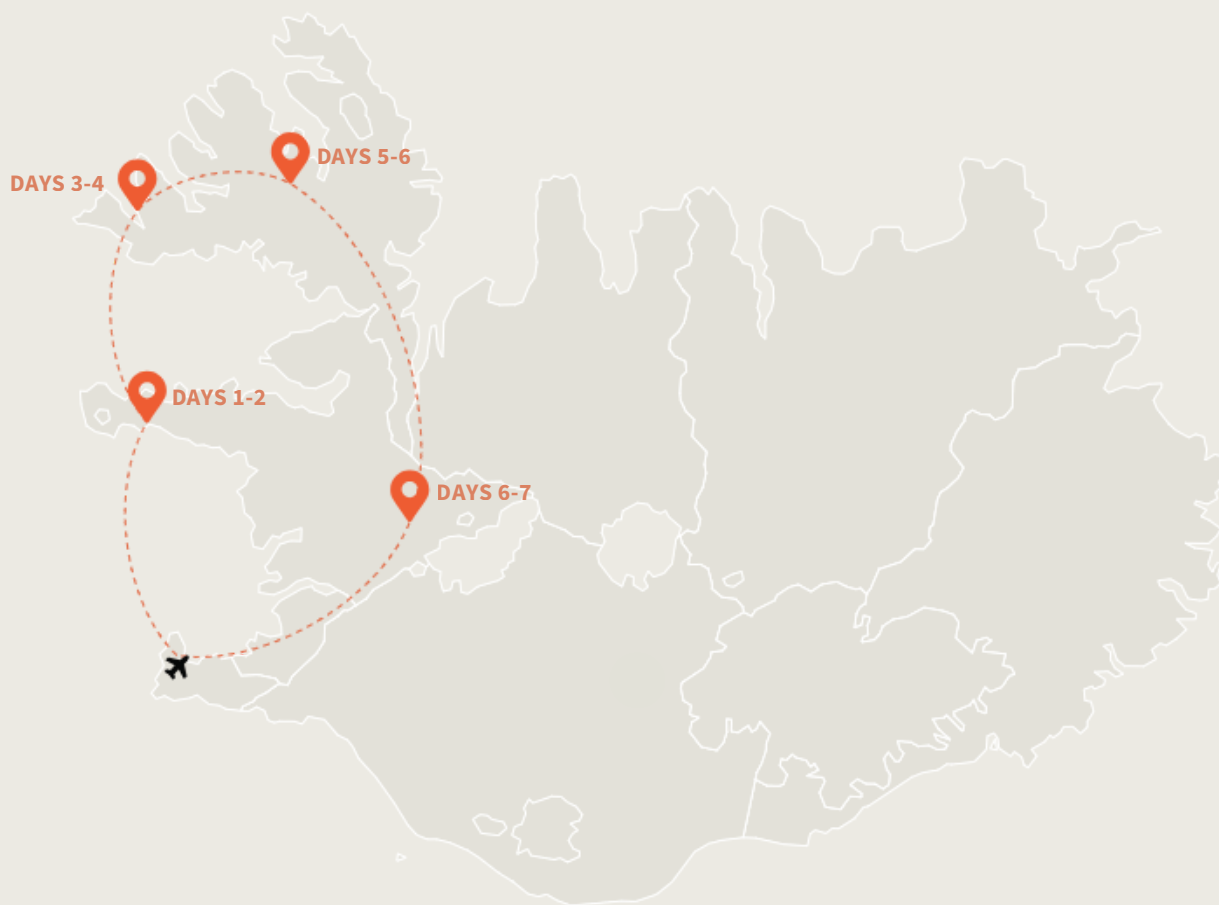

Iceland's Forgotten Coast.

Most of Iceland's visitors follow the same route. This program goes somewhere else entirely. The Westfjords cover nearly a quarter of Iceland's coastline and hold less than one percent of its tourists — towering bird cliffs, red sand beaches, remote fjords, and a pace of life that the rest of the country has largely left behind. Snæfellsnes opens the journey with its own extraordinary landscapes — a glacier-capped volcano, lava fields, and a coastline so varied it has stood in for other worlds on screen. Nine days through the parts of Iceland that the map marks but the crowds never reach.

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Journey Itinerary

Day 1: Snæfellsnes Peninsula Drive and Welcome Dinner

Your Local Host meets the group in Reykjavik before heading west along the coast. The drive passes through a small historic town with a strong saga heritage, then pauses at a striking formation of hexagonal basalt columns rising from the hillside — one of Iceland's more quietly extraordinary geological features. The group arrives at Hotel Búðir in the late afternoon, a remote and beautifully situated hotel on the edge of a lava field with the ocean and glacier in view. A welcome cocktail is followed by dinner at the hotel.

Day 2: Snæfellsjökull National Park and the Shark Museum

A full day on the Snæfellsnes Peninsula — a stretch of Iceland so varied in its landscapes that locals call it Iceland in miniature. The morning explores Snæfellsjökull National Park, where moss-covered lava fields, dramatic coastal cliffs, black and golden beaches, and volcanic craters create a constantly shifting panorama. The day's most memorable stop is a family-run shark museum, where the owner — known simply as the Shark Man — shares the centuries-old tradition of fermenting Greenlandic shark and invites the group to try a piece. It is an acquired taste. Most acquire it.

Day 3: Ferry to Flatey Island and Onward to the Westfjords

The morning begins with a ferry crossing of Breiðafjörður Bay to Flatey — a tiny, car-free island of painted timber houses, wildflowers, and an extraordinary density of seabirds. Lunch is served at the island's charming hotel before a second ferry crossing continues to the Westfjords. The drive to Patreksfjörður winds through one of Iceland's most remote and dramatic regions, arriving in time to settle in and explore the town independently for dinner.

Day 4: Látrabjarg Bird Cliffs and Rauðasandur Beach

Two of the Westfjords' most remarkable natural sites fill the day. Látrabjarg is the westernmost point in Iceland — a towering cliff face that is home to millions of seabirds, including puffins so unintimidated by human visitors that they will perch within arm's reach. The afternoon moves to one of Iceland's most surprising beaches: a long sweep of red and golden sand, entirely unlike the black beaches that define most of the country's coastline, framed by mountains and an almost total absence of other people. The group gathers for dinner at the hotel in the evening.

Day 5: Dynjandi Waterfall, Ísafjörður, Brewery Tour, and Heydalur

The drive north passes one of Iceland's most spectacular waterfalls — a cascading series of drops that widens as it falls, like a vast bridal veil spread across the mountainside. The group continues to Ísafjörður, the Westfjords' largest town and a place of genuine character, with colorful historic buildings, a lively harbor, and time to explore independently. The afternoon brings a private tour and tasting at a local craft brewery, before the group transfers to Heydalur — a remote valley retreat with hot tubs, a natural pool, and dinner by the fire.

Day 6: Heydalur Activities

Today belongs entirely to the Heydalur valley. A guided hike through the surrounding hills opens up wide views across the fjord and the remote landscape beyond. The rest of the day is yours — the outdoor hot tubs, the natural geothermal pool, and the stillness of a valley that sees very few visitors. For those who want more, horseback riding and kayaking on the fjord are available as optional add-ons. Dinner at the hotel closes another excellent day.

Day 7: Hólmavík, Reykholt, Lava Waterfalls, and Husafell

A long but rewarding drive east takes the group through the Westfjords and into the interior of West Iceland. A stop in Hólmavík provides a chance to explore a small coastal town with a good local restaurant. Reykholt follows — one of Iceland's most significant historical sites, the home of the medieval author and chieftain Snorri Sturluson, where an ancient geothermally-heated pool he bathed in still sits intact after eight centuries. The day ends at a series of spring-fed waterfalls that seep silently through ancient lava fields before tumbling into a clear glacial river — an extraordinary and little-known phenomenon. The group arrives at Hotel Husafell for the final two nights.

Day 8: Husafell Canyon Baths and Lava Caving

The day is built around two of Iceland's more unusual and memorable experiences. A hike through the Husafell canyon leads to natural geothermal baths tucked into the rock — warm, secluded, and entirely unlike anything else on the program. The afternoon moves underground: a guided tour through a lava tube cave, where the solidified walls and ceiling of an ancient lava flow create a cathedral-like passage beneath the surface. Dinner at the hotel ends what has been one of the most distinctive days of the journey.

Day 9: Departure and Journey Conclusion

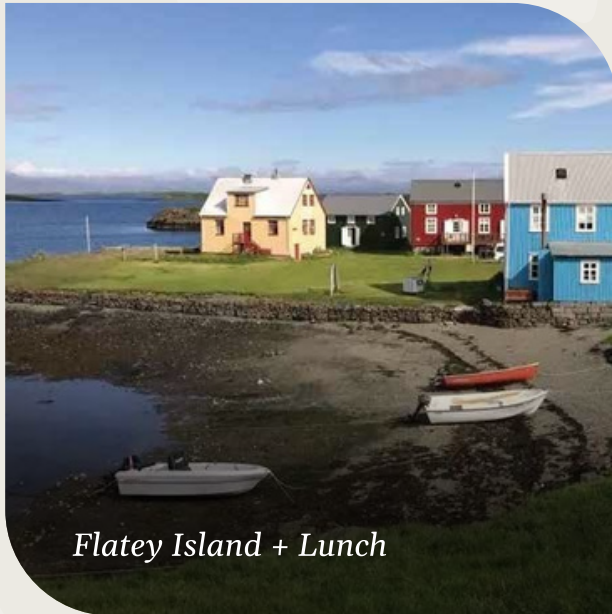
After breakfast at Hotel Husafell, the group transfers back to Reykjavik or directly to the international airport. The drive passes through West Iceland's open landscapes one last time — a fitting close to a program that covered some of the most remote and least-visited terrain in the country. Nine days through a side of Iceland that most travelers never find, and never forget.

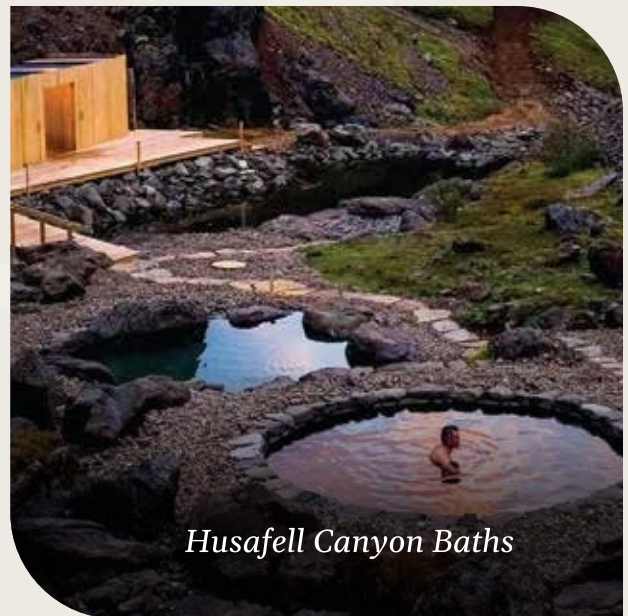

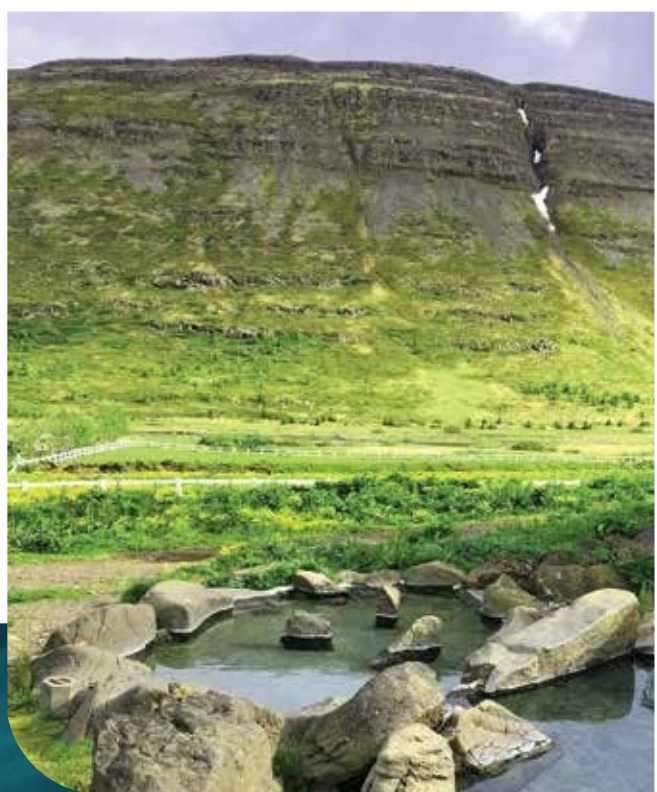

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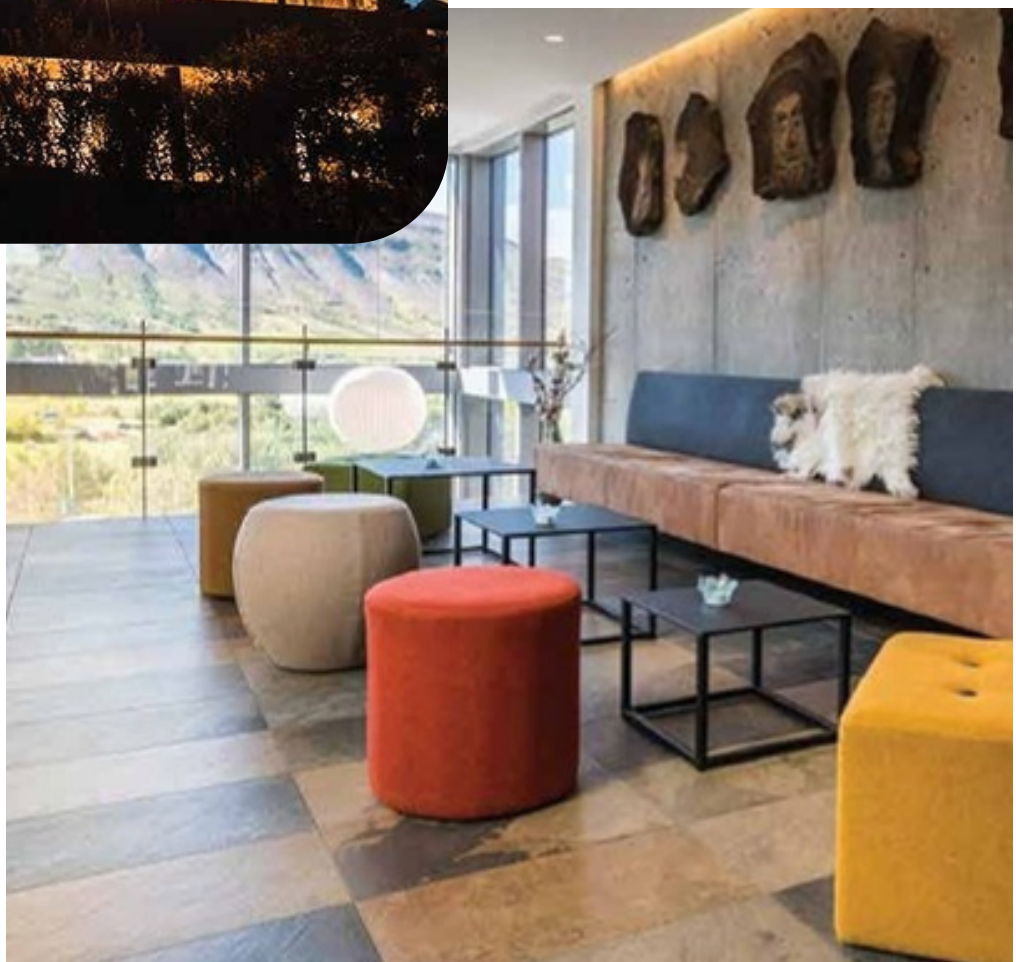
